Mark your gear so it goes back home with you and not someone that has a similar biner or rope.
6. Rain gear and good footwear are a must, weather is unpredictable and we work and play outside most of the day. Bring a notepad and writing implement.
7. Accommodations: Tents, RV's, Bivvy sacks. Shower facilities are on site courtesy of the Blue Mountain Patrol.
8. Clothing: Black tie optional. We play in the dirt, expect to get messy.
9. We are very fortunate to have the use of this facility. Please schedule time to be part of the cleanup of the property on Sunday.
